WTP	Water Treatment Plant	Facility used to treat water from the surface or ground to then serve it to an water system for use
PFAS	Per- and Polyfluorinated Substances	Group of long-lasting chemicals that are found in water, air, fish, and soil at locations across the nation and globe from widespread use
MA MCL	Massachusetts Maximum Contaminant Level	A public drinking water standard for specific contaminants as regulated by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection. For example, the MA MCL for PFAS is 20 ppt
MassDEP	Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection	Regulatory agency that oversees, among other things, drinking water treatment and compliance
EPA MCL	Environment Protection Agency Maximum Contaminant Level	The maximum level of a contaminant allowed in water according to the EPA. For example, the EPA MCL for PFAS is 4.0 ppt
SRF	State Revolving Fund Program	Program that offers financing options to cities, towns, and public water utilities to improve water supply infrastructure and drinking water safety.
PFOA	Perfluorooctanoic acid	One of the large group of chemicals related to PFAS. One of the oldest in use, and therefore widely prevalent and studied.
PFOS	Perfluorooctanesulfonic acid	One of the large group of chemicals related to PFAS. One of the oldest in use, and therefore widely prevalent and studied.
